The Alberta Lottery Fund

- The Alberta Lottery Fund (ALF) is the government's share of net proceeds from video lottery terminals, casino gaming terminals, electronic bingo and ticket lotteries.
- The Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission (AGLC) generates revenue for the ALF through its conduct and management of provincial gaming activities.
- In 2013-2014, nearly \$1.5 billion went into the ALF.
- The use of lottery dollars is transparent, as ALF expenditures are voted on in the Legislature.
 Supported programs, projects and foundations are administered by various ministries.
